Charles Vono presided at the meeting and Susan Merrill, Executive Secretary, was on the phone.

1. Introductions and Welcome – Charles Vono

The meeting began at 12:05 p.m.

Brad Allen from USPE (Utah Society of Professional Engineers) was in attendance to learn more about the Utah Engineers Council.

Susan Merrill mentioned that the UEC website has been really sluggish lately and some people have had issues with accessing it. She does not know why this is happening.

Introductions were made.

2. Approval of Minutes – January 4, 2017 - Charlie Vono

Motion: Brian Warner moved to accept the January 4, 2017 minutes. Max Gandy seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Financial Report - Max Gandy

Max Gandy passed out the current financial report. We are still waiting to receive all of our scholarship pledges. Once we do, we will have all our 9 scholarships covered. The report is attached to the minutes. BAE and STEM have been invoiced and Charles will follow up with Angie.

Charles Vono had dinner last night with BAE Director and asked if the pledged checks could be sent soon. Susan Merrill sent an invoice to Orbital ATK. Max received the ASPE check for \$1,500.

We have collected \$8,929 for scholarships and with carry-over from last year total in the scholarship account is \$10,543. Our goal is \$14,000 for scholarships. We have received \$19,000 in pledges. ACEC pledged \$1,500. Health Engineering pledged \$500, ATK Orbital pledged \$1,500, Air Force Aerospace Association (STEM?) pledged \$1,500, BAE pledged \$4,000 - \$3,000 for scholarships and \$1,000 for banquet; Charlie Vono pledged \$1,500. All Society dues are received and deposited for a total of \$4439.58.

Our Operating balance \$5,548. Ticket sales are \$2,365 which does not include transactions updated for today. Susan made a PayPal deposit today and those figures have not been added to our totals yet.

ACEC will be sending a check for their banquet tickets.

Think of people who would like to buy tickets and ask them to do so. It's okay to ask them more than once.

4. STEM and Utah Board of Education - Roberta Schlicher

Roberta has not heard anything back from the committee or Glo Merrill. Her emails are being bounced back from Glo Merrill.

ComicCon booth – Roberta Schlicher would like to look into this and needs the Alliant Tech contact. Charlie asked Roberta to send him an email reminder. Alliant Tech is now Orbital ATK. The Hill AFB E-Week calendar is almost done and Roberta will get that to Susan to put on the UEC website. The UEC banquet flyer will be distributed to the SAME membership. SAME has a couple of tours coming up in the spring. Susan can put that information on the UEC website.

5. Publishing Committee: article status - Dannie Pollock

We have 10 articles and need more articles. We are lacking advertisers for the Journal. We need to keep asking for advertisers. Dannie has sent a list of items still needed for the Journal – message from the Chair, nominees, scholarship winners, bios and high resolution photos. Dannie contacted the governor's office for the proclamation a couple of months ago. Dannie is following up on that. Val Hale from the governor's office is coming to the banquet and might be able to help with the proclamation since he is supposed to present it at the banquet. Angie Tymofichuk is friends with Val Hale and might be able to contact him about it.

Dannie has requested the list of articles from Juli so we can see whose articles are missing. This is a great place to advertise to all of the industry people. We have cut back on printed copies and are moving towards an online Journal. We have cut costs, but still need more advertisers.

6. Scholarship Committee - Max Gandy

Scholarship Committee – Max has received 38 applications for 9 scholarships. They will be judged by Friday. We need to invite the winners to the banquet as soon as we can. Max hesitates to invite more than we actually have money in the bank to cover. ASHRAE would like to provide two scholarships with their funding at the banquet. We have a few societies that have funded scholarships. We will arrange for those who have paid for a full scholarship to make the presentation. We can count the ASHRAE scholarships as part of our 9 if needed. The winners will be chosen by Friday. Angie Tymofichuk, Rob Kesler and Scott Stebbins are on the committee.

7. E-Week Committee - Jed Lyman

We have the venue worked out and Jed is finalizing with the caterer and working on the bar. McNeil Engineering May sponsor part of the bar and also General Distribution. The committee is working on the alcohol deal. The room is no longer called the Budweiser room. We have a photographer on board who is an architect that will charge \$250. We also have live entertainment for the social hour. It is a jazz quartet with a vocalist. It will cost \$750, but we will pay \$1,000 if we have the income. The banquet will cost us around \$12,000. We need to sell more tickets. The room will seat 250 comfortably.

8. Fund-raising Committee - Brian Warner

Brian has struggled with getting other donations. He would like all of the UEC Representatives to go to their companies and solicit UEC donations. Many companies don't see the benefit of sponsorship.

9. Awards Committee - Rob Kesler

Each society with nominees needs to encourage nominees to invite other people to come and help support them. Rob will do an engraved award for the winners and do the standard less expensive award for all of the nominees. We don't do plaques for the scholarship winners or the MESA teacher. We do need a plaque for the past Chair.

10. Membership Committee - Angie Tymofichuk

Charlie had spoken with Angie prior to the meeting and she had nothing to report. USPE can.work with Angie if they want to pursue membership.

11. Legislative Committee - Chris Perry

Chris Perry attended the Utah Technology Symposium. He has been looking at watch lists from various organizations. He has seen some technology related bills, but nothing specific to engineering in general. There are some technology-related bills. There are training rooms at the capitol where people can meet with legislators. Utah is looking at non-compete agreements. He learned that California does not allow non-compete agreements. That is good for startups, but bad for big companies wanting to keep their talent. He has some other things to report that he will forward on to the Board. There are entities wanting to expand industry education partnership. Past UEC banquet speaker Richard Brown from U of U presented to the group the Utah Engineering Initiative. They are seeking funding to help promote engineers. They promised 250 engineers and have produced more than 650. Anything that you see in the legislature that impacts your business or engineering, let Chris Perry know.

12. Nominating Committee – Brian Warner

This committee needs to present a slate of nominees at the March meeting, as per the by-laws. We need to find a Treasurer for next year.
